Dr. Suzanne Gray's section – Monday/ Wednesday

Focus is on the integration of students' knowledge of social-ecological systems, natural resources management and environmental science with an emphasis on water and aquatic issues from local to global scales.

Dr. Matt Davies' section – Tuesday/Thursday

Focus is on the development of restoration management plans. Working with a variety of stakeholders and real restoration problems, students will form mini-restoration consultancies to develop an adaptive plan for the management of a degraded site.
