COMM 4240, Science Communication will be offered Spring 2018

This class is one of the core classes needed to complete the Health, Environment, Risk, and Science Communication minor and is only offered every two years. This course is designed for non-communication majors.

The course focuses on "strategic science communication" across a range of science and environmental contexts, with a special focus on communicating about controversial science or environmental issues.

The class is taught in a hybrid format, meeting once a week for 2 hrs, but has substantial out of class activities such as field trips (e.g. COSI, Creation Museum in Kentucky), documentary viewing, online lectures, and other out of class activities.

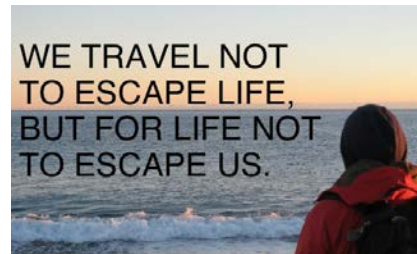

Master workshop: Water and Public Trust Law and Rights, with James Olson, JD, Traverse City

James Olson, JD, will present a free special master workshop, **Water and Public Trust Law and Rights**, Monday, **October 9, 2:30 to 4 PM** at OSU in Hitchcock Hall Room 410. This workshop and the breakfast program the following morning are planned by the School of Environment and Natural Resources' Environmental Professionals Network and the Ohio Water Resources Center in the Department of Civil, Environment, and Geodetic Engineering. Olson has been a champion of protecting the public's rights and interests for water and drinking water in the Great Lakes region and beyond for decades, and his suits opposing large corporate withdrawals/transfers of water out of the Great Lakes' watershed were a catalyst for the "Great Lakes Compact". For the master workshop, students and practicing attorneys and environmental professionals are sought to attend who have substantial interest in water resources in Ohio and the U.S. and the laws and principles that support and govern them.
