What are YOUR summer plans?

Still looking for an internship for this summer? Many employers have already begun their interview process so don't wait another day to get started on your search. Here are a few tips to get your search off on the right track:

Activate your account on [Hireabuckeye](#), the College's online job database, and scroll through SENR's meticulously updated [job board](#). New opportunities are posted every day, Monday – Friday. You can search for jobs AND employers can look for YOU. Employers have their own accounts and can view resumes on line and invite students to apply for positions, both internships and permanent positions.

1. Spruce up your resume (if you haven't already). The [Resume](#) page of our website is a great resource to get you started with a basic chronological resume format for students.
2. Once you have a solid resume draft ready and a list of potential opportunities narrowed down, call 614-292-2265 to schedule a meeting in our Career Development office with Trish Raridan Preston. Trish can help you sharpen your resume, guide you in the job application process and often times can provide referrals for you.

Once you have landed your summer experience, don't forget to **get registered for academic credit!** Check out [THIS INFORMATION](#) on how to get registered for your experience and about the internship course. Credit must be arranged **BEFORE your work experience begins**, not after. Credit can be awarded for your experience whether it is paid or volunteer.
