

The ENR Alumni Society is also excited to announce the selection of the 2020 ENR Honorary 100 recipients. The Honorary 100 includes individuals who lent their support during the formative years of the School of Natural Resources. Many of these individuals expressed a desire to maintain a continuing supportive affiliation with SENR. The ENR Alumni Society, with the endorsement of SENR and CFAES, works to continue the Honorary 100 as a non-dues paying affiliate of the ENR Alumni Society, and annually seeks to enlarge the membership by recognizing outstanding Ohioans who have significantly demonstrated an interest in the School of Environment and Natural Resources and its mission. This year's recipients are as follows:



Jerry Bigham, PhD, SENR professor and SENR Director – Emeritus Jerry M. Bigham joined OSU's Agronomy Department in 1977 as an Assistant Professor. In 1982, Dr. Bigham was promoted to Associate Professor and then to Professor in 1992. In 1994, Dr. Bigham became a member of the School of Natural Resources faculty following an administrative reorganization of the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. Ten years after his move to the school, Dr. Bigham accepted the role of interim director in August 2004, and then he was subsequentially appointed director in June 2005. It was during this time that Dr. Bigham had a vital role in incorporating and establishing the School under the new name, School of Environment and Natural Resources.



Daniel Balser, Chief, ODNR Division of Forestry

As chief of the ODNR Division of Forestry, Chief Balser oversees operations of more than 200,000 acres of Ohio's state forests and leads the work of promoting sustainable management of Ohio's 8 million forested acres, including 5.8 million acres of family-owned forestland through the division's Service Forestry Program. Additionally, he assists local communities with tree care, planting and inventory through the Urban Forestry Program as well as work to safeguard Ohio's woodlands from wildfires, insects and diseases.





Lorraine Winters Krzyzewski, Watershed Manager, City of Columbus

Lorraine Winters Krzyzewski is the Watershed Manager for the City of Columbus. She is passionate about clean water and has the drive to find sustainable solutions to water quality issues, and seeks to engage, educate and empower individuals to be active and to work for the protection of our water resources. Lorraine been employed with the Columbus Division of Water, Watershed Management Office as a Watershed Manager since 1996. She oversees direct source water protection activities to safeguard drinking water supplies for communities served by the City of Columbus Division of Water.



Mark Dilley, Mad Scientist Associates, LLC and ENRAS Professional Wetland Scientist, Certified Senior Ecologist; Chief Scientist, MAD Scientist Associates, LLC

Mark Dilley is the Chief Scientist and founder of MAD Scientist Associates, LLC based in Westerville, Ohio. MAD Scientist Associates LLC (MAD) established in 1998 by husband and wife team, Christine S. Dilley and Mark A. Dilley. Chris is the company's CEO and Mark serves as its Chief Scientist. 




ENGAGEMENT SCORE


The Ohio State Alumni App




