ENR HONORARY 100

The Honorary 100 includes individuals who lent their support during the formative years of the School of Natural Resources. Many of these individuals expressed a desire to maintain a continuing supportive affiliation with SENR. The ENR Alumni Society, with the endorsement of the SENR and CFAES, will continue the Honorary 100 as a non-dues paying affiliate of the ENR Alumni Society, and will annually seek to enlarge it by recognizing outstanding Ohioans who have demonstrated an interest in the School of Environment and Natural Resources and its mission.

- 1. Purposes of the Honorary 100
 - a. Support legislation and budgets related to SENR
 - b. Provide a sounding board for SENR programs
 - c. Assist in recruiting students at both the undergraduate and graduate levels
 - d. Provide a contact and liaison with related public agencies
 - e. Provide a statewide constituency
 - f. Assist in fundraising and development activities
- 2. Criteria for Selecting Honorary 100 Candidates
 - a. Must have displayed an interest in the environment and natural resources, especially in the School of Environment and Natural Resources, it's programs and activities
 - Such an interest should be sincere, and have shown some ongoing involvement and activity related to events, programs, scholarship, professional development, donor support, etc.
 - c. The person should have personal qualities that also make him/her a Recognized individual.
 - d. Selection may also include an individual who has done special action or activity such as legislation, writing or publication, community action, program or agency organization, financial support, program development, academic achievement, etc.
 - e. Individuals considered might also be a legislator, industrialist, banker, teacher, lobbyist, association leader or participant, researcher, etc.
 - f. Candidates need not be an Ohio State, or SENR graduate.

Process for selection

The ENR Alumni Society will continue its responsibility for the solicitation of candidates for consideration for ENR Honorary 100 awards.

- Nominations will be solicited throughout the year and reviewed by the ENRAS Awards and Recognition committee in February of each calendar year.
- Committee recommendations will be brought before the ENRAS Executive Committee in February of each calendar year.
- Upon approval by ENRAS, these recommendations are forwarded for review and formal approval by the SENR Director and the CFAES Awards and Recognition Committee.
- ENR Honorary 100 Awardees will notify candidates of their selection. ENRAS and SENR will invite awards to an awards reception held in April of each calendar year. (EPN Signature Event Monday, April 8, 2019).
- Remaining members of the ENR Honorary 100 will also be invited to this reception. Other
 distinguished SENR Alumni, friends, stakeholders and supporters will be invited to the
 reception. School and CFAES Administrators and faculty leaders will also be invited to
 the reception.
- Each awardee will be presented with an ENR Honorary 100 plague.
