


Figure 1: Morning work on the Stillwater River, Stillwater Prairie Reserve, Covington, Ohio. (Demmitt, H. 2020, May 13).

ON THE JOB

While working for the Park District, I was able to gain a plethora of knowledge about Natural Resource Stewardship, Park Management, and other skills critical to taking care of our environment, such as:

- Removal of invasive species including Honeysuckle, Callery Pear Trees, and Autumn Olive throughout multiple park properties using the cut & treat method.
- Application of herbicide to invasive species such as Poison Hemlock and Garlic Mustard using backpack sprayers.
- Operated heavy machinery to remove logs and downed trees.
- Completed Ohio EPA chemical logs following the completion of spraying and application.
- Assisted the public on canoe floats that the Park District held to connect visitors to the outdoors.
- Built new trails and picnic areas for the public to enjoy.

Installation of a New Trail & Bridge at SPR




Figure 3: Progress of a project I got to work on this summer of a new trail being installed in SPR that opened to the public this fall. The new trail gives visitors more area to hike, walk, and run and more opportunity to connect with the outdoors. (Demmitt, H. 2020, June 16).
