Program Overview

This summer, from May 2022 to August 2022, I worked as an Environment, Social, Governance (ESG) Intern at JOANN Craft Stores. My role was full-time (40 hrs/week) and I worked out of JOANN's corporate office in Hudson, Ohio every weekday.

JOANN has an internship program that runs every summer. They accept around ~25-30 interns that are each placed in a different department within the company. The internship program is project-based, meaning each intern is given a project to work on throughout the summer, then present to the company at the end of the internship

1) Readiness assessment for the Human Right Campaign's Corporate Equality index




2) Edit and compile JOANN's first ESG report

4) Research and outline the materiality assessment process




Corporate Equality Index was my primary summer project, which I presented to the CEO and senior team at the end of the internship.

What I learned


- Gave me an inside look into how businesses engage with sustainability
