Position Background


Over the summer and this fall, I have worked as a zero waste intern with Ohio State's Facilities, Operation and Development (FOD) sustainability department that is located on west campus.

FOD ensures that campus facilities are well managed and are properly operating. This department of FOD focuses on the operations for zero waste and sustainability on campus.

I found this internship through the SENR intro survey course and a stadium zero waste tour. I applied at the end of Spring 2022 semester and secured this position. I have the option to work until graduation.



On The Job



My roles as a zero waste intern varied from day to day, but mainly included:

- Auditing campus building waste infrastructures and writing reports to address any problems found and recommending solutions.
- Tabling events for;
 - OSU staff bin distribution for the compost drop-off program
 - Educating students on dorm/café compost program
 - Informing students about compost bins for their dorm rooms
- Working with Wexner's sustainability team to implement recycling by installing recycling bins in the nursing stations of The James Hospital.
- Installing exterior and interior compost bins to all campus dorms and cafes.
- Excel data reporting on campus composting infrastructure and metrics.
- Working at Ohio State Stadium


Other Experiences

I was able to work at the stadium with:


- Educating fans/venders on zero waste, and recycling/composting materials.
