On camp I was the James C. Justice Scout Camp Shooting Sports Director, the Marksman Experience Director, and the Barrels Manager.

- I taught archery, rifle, and shotgun merit badges, and trained the other staff for it as well.
- Every day I instructed various shooting disciplines and acted as a range safety officer
- After the Marksman week, I moved to the Barrels High Adventure shooting ranges and was chief range safety officer (CRSO).
- As CRSO, I gave safety briefings and managed all 25 barrels staff.

Marksman Experience

- The marksman experience is a high adventure program at the Summit that allows Scout crews to have a unique and focused shooting sports adventure.

- Receive high level instruction in archery, pistol, shotgun, and rifle shooting.
- Learn about hunter's safety, conservation, and wildlife management.
- · Hit a target 1000 yards away with a rifle.
- Develop leadership skills.
- · Grow closer together as a crew
