Course Description

This seminar course is designed to expose students in the Master of Environment and Natural Resources (MENR) graduate program to environmental professional practice-oriented seminars, conferences, and other forums. Students are required to take a minimum of 2 semesters of the MENR seminar course (ENR 7981) as a part of their degree program. This course allows students to:

- Network within the environmental professional practice community
- Develop a breadth of knowledge in the field
- Learn about current issues in the field
- Gain professional growth



How This Course Works

Students are required to attend a minimum of 5-7 in-person events totaling a minimum of 10 contact hours. If for any reason students must attend online events, with the approval of the MENR Director or MENR Program Manager, the number of required events will be increased. Events must be approved by the MENR Director or Program Manager for them to count toward the needed contact hours. Following each event, an event summary (1-2 pages, single-spaced) is expected to be submitted within one week of attending the event.

Course Technologies

CarmenCanvas Access

You will need to use BuckeyePass (buckeyepass.osu.edu) multi-factor authentication to access your courses in Carmen. To ensure that you are able to connect to Carmen at all times, it is recommended that you do each of the following:

- Install the Duo Mobile application (go.osu.edu/install-duo) on all of your registered devices for the ability to generate one-time codes in the event that you lose cell, data, or Wi-Fi service.

Descriptions of Major Course Assignments

The following assignments will be submitted to the Carmen course (also see Carmen for due dates and for COVID-related guidance):

A. Draft MENR Seminar Advising Sheet

This is an initial list of the seminars you plan to attend so they can be reviewed and approved. Because this is a preliminary draft of the seminar advising sheet, we expect that you might make changes to your event list, as you hear about other opportunities; please have at least 3-4 events listed at this time. The others may be listed as To Be Determined (TBD).

B. Final MENR Seminar Advising Sheet

This will be a final list of events you plan to attend, and should list a minimum of 5-7 events, totaling a minimum of 10 contact hours. In the event that a seminar isn't available, falls through, or you cannot attend for some reason, please contact the instructors for approval of alternative events.

C. Event Summaries

A one to two-page, single-spaced summary must be submitted for each event attended, within one week of the event. The following information must be submitted at the top of each summary:

- Host organization presenting the event
- Title of the event
- Format of the event (conference, workshop, webinar, etc. and whether it was live/in-person or virtual)
- Date of the event
- Date attended (if different, such as for a recorded webinar)
- Length/number of hours attended for the event
